



## Sandscape User Guide

Your Sandscape will last for years with proper care. This user guide will help you maintain your Sandscape.

<i><b>Problem</b></i>	<i><b>Solution</b></i>
<p>At some time, some of the liquid may be replaced by air, which will <u><b>stop the sand from falling.</b></u></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Make a solution using 3 drops of dish washing detergent to 1 cup of water. Mix thoroughly.</li> <li>2. Fill a small syringe with the solution.</li> <li>3. Remove one of the pegs on side of sandscape and insert the needle only to equalize pressure.</li> <li>4. Attach syringe to the needle and inject approximately 2 cc of solution into picture.</li> <li>5. Withdraw the same amount of air. Continue this process until only enough air remains to make a thin line of small bubbles across the top.</li> </ol>
<p>Too much liquid caused by <u><b>no or very little air</b></u></p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Remove one of the pegs on side of sandscape and insert the needle only to equalize pressure.</li> <li>2. After pressure equalizes if liquid is coming out of needle, withdraw about 1 cc of liquid and add 1 cc of air. Repeat procedure until you have a thin line of air bubbles across top.</li> </ol>
